PROTECTION OF YOUR PERSONAL DATA

Processing operation: Processing of personal data linked to meetings and events in the context of the implementation of the Communication (2021) 345 "A long-term Vision for the EU's Rural Areas" and the activities of the Rural Pact.

Data Controller: Directorate General Agriculture and Rural Development, Directorate D – CAP Strategic Plans II, Unit D1 – Rural Areas and networks

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1. Introduction

The European Commission is committed to protect your personal data and to respect your privacy. The Commission collects and further processes personal data pursuant to <u>Regulation (EU)</u> 2018/1725 of the European Parliament and of the Council on the protection of natural persons with regard to the processing of personal data by the Union institutions, bodies, offices and agencies and on the free movement of such data.

This privacy statement explains the reason for the processing of your personal data in the context of the meetings and events organised by DG AGRI, unit D.1 Rural Areas and Networks in close cooperation with its contractor AEIDL, known as the Rural Pact Support Office (hereafter RPSO). It explains the way we collect, handle and ensure protection of all personal data provided, how that information is used and what rights you have in relation to your personal data. It also specifies the contact details of the responsible Data Controller with whom you may exercise your rights, the Data Protection Officer and the European Data Protection Supervisor.

The information in relation to the processing of personal data linked to the meetings and events organised by AGRI D.1, is presented below.

2. Why and how do we process your personal data?

<u>Purpose of the processing operation</u>: AGRI D.1 collects and further processes your personal data to provide you with information about the meetings and events organised under the activities of the long-term vision for rural areas (before, during and after) and to process your application for participation in that event.

Your personal data will not be used for any automated decision-making including profiling.

Audio-visual recording of the speakers, organisers and participants, as well as photographs of the speakers and panoramic photographs of participants and organisers will be taken and published in the context of the long-term vision for rural areas project at <u>www.rural-vision.europa.eu</u>.

The audience or non-speaker participants are not photographed individually or in groups. They may however appear on panoramic photographs of the whole event/audience.

Audience and non-speaker participants may also be photographed individually or in groups if they have provided their explicit consent to this.

Participants that do not wish to be part of the above recording/publishing activities have the possibility to withdraw their consent (photographs of audience and non-speaker participants) or object to processing (other types of participants to the meeting or event) by sending an e-mail to <u>ec-vision-rural-areas@ec.europa.eu</u> or by warning staff on the day of the event.

3. On what legal ground(s) do we process your personal data?

The processing operations on personal data, linked to the organisation, management, follow-up and promotion of the meeting or event (including web-streaming, photos, audio-visual recording) are necessary for the management and functioning of the Commission, as mandated by the Treaties. Those provisions are in particular, Article 11 of the Treaty on European Union and Article 15 of the Treaty on the Functioning of the European Union, and the objectives of the COM(2021)345 "A long-term Vision for the EU's Rural Areas.

Consequently, the processing of the data of **individuals essential to the good outcome of the event (such as organisers, authorities and speakers**, once they have agreed to take on the role)

are lawful under Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (processing is necessary for the performance of a task carried out in the public interest or in the exercise of official authority vested in the Union institution or body).

We process panoramic photographs and audio-visual recordings of (large sections of) the event under the same basis, as they are necessary for communication and knowledge sharing concerning EU rural development policy and it is generally not possible to isolate the personal data of any one participant during the processing.

The processing operations on personal data of **any contracted participant or staff** are carried out in line with the contractual provisions. Consequently, that processing is necessary and lawful under Article 5(1)(c) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 (processing is necessary for the performance of a contract to which the data subject is party or in order to take steps at the request of the data subject prior to entering into a contract).

The processing of personal data of **all other individuals** is based on consent. Your consent is required for the following actions during the meetings and events:

- □ the general processing of your personal data needed to allow you to participate to the event (to allow you to access the event premises for example).
- □ the taking of photographs portraying you individually or in groups, and their publication;
- □ the sharing of the meeting or event participants list containing your name and affiliation with other participants for networking and collaboration purposes;
- □ the arrangement of your travels, if you are eligible;

The processing of your personal data relating to your dietary requirements and/or access requirements, if you have any, is always based on your consent, regardless of your status in the meeting or event.

If you opt-in, you are giving us your explicit consent under Article 5(1)(d) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 to process your personal data for those specific purposes. You can give your consent via a clear affirmative act by ticking the box(es) on the online registration form.

Your consent for these services can be withdrawn at any time by contacting the controller at <u>ec-</u><u>vision-rural-areas@ec.europa.eu</u>.

4. Which personal data do we collect and further process?

The following personal data may be processed in the context of the meetings and events:

- contact details (function/title, first name, last name, name of organisation, city, country, e-mail address, telephone number);
- nationality, passport or identity card number and its date of issue and expiry date may be collected, so that the data subjects may obtain access to the premises where the meeting/event is held;
- first name, last name, e-mail address, date of birth, country & city of departure / preferred route, so that subjects may see their travel and accommodation arranged by the contractor AMEX reimbursed, if applicable;

- dietary requests or specific access requirements (if any);
- audio-visual recordings and pictures may be taken during the event. General participants will not be included in these if not as part of the crowd unless they give their specific consent on the inscription form.

5. How long do we keep your personal data?

The Data Controller only keeps your personal data for the time necessary to fulfil the purpose of collection or further processing.

For each of the categories of personal data that may be processed, please find below the retention details and the reference to the relevant record of processing:

- Personal data related to the organisation and management of the meeting or event (this includes the information given during the registration, before, during or after the event) will be kept for **5 years** after the meeting or event.
- Sensitive personal data relating to dietary and/or access requirements will be deleted as soon as they are no longer necessary for the purpose for which they have been collected in the framework of the meeting or event, but no later than within **1 month** after the end of the meeting or event.
- Recordings and photographs from the event will be kept for a maximum of 2 years, after the closure of the related file (communication of LTVRA activities for the time period 2022-2025), planned for the end of 2025.Selected files may be retained for permanent preservation in the Commission archives. Selected files may also be published on social media. You can at any point revoke your consent or oppose the publication of files which include you by contacting the controller, AGRI D.1, at <u>ec-vision-ruralareas@ec.europa.eu</u>.
- Personal data shared with the Directorate-General for Human Resources and Security of the European Commission for the participants to gain access to Commission buildings is kept for 6 months after the termination of the link between the data subject and the Commission. More information is available in the Record of Processing DPR-EC-00655 (Commission Physical Access Control System (PACS)).
- Personal data shared with the controller for future mailing purposes (e.g., for receiving newsletters or invitations to similar events) are processed in line with the Processing DPR-EC-03928 (Management of subscriptions to receive information) or, for Rural Pact Community Newsletter, in line with the Record of Processing DPR-EC-21628 (Rural Pact Community Platform).

6. How do we protect and safeguard your personal data?

All personal data in electronic format (e-mails, documents, databases, uploaded batches of data, etc.) are stored on the servers of the European Commission or of its contractors. All processing operations are carried out pursuant to <u>Commission Decision (EU, Euratom) 2017/46</u> of 10 January 2017 on the security of communication and information systems in the European Commission.

In order to protect your personal data, the Commission has put in place a number of technical and organisational measures. Technical measures include appropriate actions to address online security, risk of data loss, alteration of data or unauthorised access, taking into consideration the risk presented by the processing and the nature of the personal data being processed. Organisational measures include restricting access to the personal data solely to authorised persons with a legitimate need to know for the purposes of this processing operation.

The Commission's processors (contractors) are bound by a specific contractual clause for any processing operations of your personal data on behalf of the Commission. The processors have to put in place appropriate technical and organisational measures to ensure the level of security, required by the Commission.

They are contractually bound to process personal data on behalf of and in line with the instructions of the data controller, keep confidential any data they process and protect it from unauthorised access, use and retention.

7. Who has access to your personal data and to whom is it disclosed?

Access to your personal data is provided to the Commission staff responsible for carrying out this processing operation and to other authorised Commission staff according to the "need to know" principle. Such staff abide by statutory, and when required, additional confidentiality agreements.

Where necessary, we may also share your information with service providers for the purposes of organising the meeting/event:

- AMEX, Global Business Travel SPRL/Bvba, Avenue des Arts 19D, 1000 Brussels, Belgium.

The publication of audio-visual recordings and pictures (speakers, high level representatives or panoramic pictures) can take place under the legal basis of public interest. The publication of individual pictures will only take place on the bases of individual consent for the general participants. For more information on the legal basis of processing, please refer to section 3.

Cookies

Cookies are short text files stored on a user's device (such as a computer, tablet or phone) by a website. Cookies are used for the technical functioning of a website (functional cookies) or for gathering statistics (analytical cookies).

The cookies employed by the Commission on the registrant's device when accessing a Commission website are covered by the cookie policy of the Commission, which is available here: https://ec.europa.eu/info/cookies_en.

When you visit the website(s) of the event, we will indicate in the specific privacy statement (for websites hosted on Europa, you will find it <u>here</u>) how long we will keep the browser history of your visit. This information will then be deleted. The collection, aggregation and anonymising operations are performed in the data centre of the European Commission under adequate security measures.

Enabling these cookies is not strictly necessary for the website to work but it will provide you with a better browsing experience. You can delete or block these cookies, but if you do that, some features of the meeting/event website may not work as intended.

The cookie-related information is not used to identify data subjects personally and the pattern data is fully under the Commission's control. These cookies are not used for any purpose other than those described here.

Should you wish to opt your personal data out of our anonymised, aggregated statistics, you can do so on our cookies page. In particular, you can control and/or delete those cookies as you wish.

Third party IT tools, including Social Media

We may use third party IT tools to inform about and promote our meetings and events through widely used communication channels, including the social media.

You may be able to watch our videos, which may be also uploaded to one of our social media pages and follow links from our website to other relevant social media.

In order to protect your privacy, our use of third party IT tools to connect to those services does not set cookies when our website pages are loaded on your computer (or other devices), nor are you immediately redirected to those social media or other websites. Only in the event that you click on a button or "play" on a video to watch it, a cookie of the social media company concerned will be installed on your device. If you do not click on any social media buttons or videos, no cookies will be installed on your device by third parties.

In order to view such third-party content on our websites, a message will alert you that you need to accept those third parties' specific Terms and Conditions, including their cookie policies, over which the Commission has no control.

We recommend that users carefully read the relevant privacy policies of the social media tools used. These explain each company's policy of personal data collection and further processing, their use of data, users' rights and the ways in which users can protect their privacy when using those services.

The use of a third party IT tool does not in any way imply that the European Commission endorses them or their privacy policies. In the event that one or more third party IT tools are occasionally unavailable, we accept no responsibility for lack of service due to their downtime.

8. What are your rights and how can you exercise them?

You have specific rights as a 'data subject' under Chapter III (Articles 14-25) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725, in particular the right to access, your personal data and to rectify them in case your personal data are inaccurate or incomplete. Where applicable, you have the right to erase your personal data, to restrict the processing of your personal data, to object to the processing, and the right to data portability.

You have the right to object to the processing of your personal data, which is lawfully carried out pursuant to Article 5(1)(a) of Regulation (EU) 2018/1725 on grounds relating to your particular situation.

As a non-speaker participant, you have consented to provide your personal data to the data controller for that processing operation. You will be able to withdraw your consent at any time by notifying AGRI.D1 by email at <u>ec-vision-rural-areas@ec.europa.eu</u>.

You can exercise your rights by contacting the data controller, or in case of conflict the Data Protection Officer. If necessary, you can also address the European Data Protection Supervisor. Their contact information is given under Heading 9 below.

Where you wish to exercise your rights in the context of one or several specific processing operations, please provide their description (i.e. their Record reference(s) as specified under Heading 10 below) in your request.
