Why?

- Agriculture and rural development sector is the main economic activity
- WB region is **rich in biodiversity**
- Balkan region, is among the **global hotspots of climate change** with aboveaverage warming and highly vulnerable populations
- Extreme weather events, such as heat waves, frost, or heavy rainfall will be a growing challenge for farmers in the Balkan region
- Region requires a paradigm shift in its economic model, based on a sustainable approach to development, where <u>agriculture and rural</u> <u>development plays an important role</u> to properly and timely address the growing environmental and climate challenges

Assessment of the CSOs capacities in the WB region

73% of CSOs reported that their organization was engaged with local farming communities to raise awareness about sustainable agricultural practices

73% believed that their organization has a positive impact toward rural and farming communities

77% of respondents were aware of the current challenges related to sustainable farming and food production in their respective country

25% of respondents perceived current policies and regulations in their countries in supporting sustainable farming and food production as effective

24% reported that their organization has not implemented at least one project applying innovative green and inclusive actions

On average 37% respondents reported lower levels of knowledge regarding

- Farm to Fork Strategy (40%)
- Not familiar with the EU Green Deal (35%);
- Not familiar with the Green Agenda for the Western Balkans (36%)





Challenges and opportunities for CSOs engagement with green agenda

Challenges

- Western Balkan region is among the global hotspots of climate change
- There is a high risk of Poverty and social exclusion
- Education of the labor force in rural areas is much lower than in urban areas
- There is an intensive depopulation of rural areas due to the high migration
- Irrespective of their important role in addressing societal challenges, yet CSOs in WB have limited impact in contributing to long-term social, political and economic transformation of the region
- Their numerical expansion has not resulted in consolidation of a vibrant and genuine civil society
- The CSOs and Farmers are aware of their limited capacities and knowledge on issues related to sustainable food system and rural livelihoods necessary for green and just transition

Opportunities

- CSOs and CSO Networks are aware of the important role in addressing societal challenges
- CSOs monitor and hold the respective governments accountable by pushing for accelerated reforms and the implementation of EU CAP policies
- Even though reforms are Governmemt-led, CSOs build trust in the reforms and generate the so needed public support in the EU integration process
- Mutual collaboration and networking
