Key points of NAT/914

The EESC:

- Supports the Long Term Vision for Rural Areas (<u>LTVRA</u>) and calls for the Rural Action Plan to be enhanced and <u>regularly evaluated</u> to respond more effectively to the needs of the rural environment;
- Calls for a multi-level and multi-stakeholder governance approach to create locally tailored priorities, with the Rural Pact as a vital tool to facilitate this collaborative governance model;
- Endorses the "Making the Rural Pact Happen" guidance and suggests a European charter outlining rights and responsibilities for both rural and urban areas;



- Advocates for a comprehensive EU rural strategy to develop a new European rural model, as recommended in the recent Council conclusions;
- Proposes a post-2027 rural development policy, with targeted funding, leveraging EU funds like the EAFRD and Structural Funds to support the long-term rural vision;
- Emphasizes prioritizing family-run businesses, small enterprises, and community-based activities in future rural development policies;



- Highlights the European Rural Observatory's role in understanding rural stakeholders' needs and suggests it monitor the implementation of the Rural Pact and Action Plan;
- Recommends adding clear targets to the Rural Action Plan for essential services like healthcare, digital access, mobility, and housing to enhance rural quality of life;
- Calls for an updated Action Plan that outlines specific commitments from Member States with defined goals, deadlines, and rigorous monitoring;



- Urges increased EU funding for rural development and simplified access through measures like streamlined application processes, InvestEU support, crowdfunding, and mutual guarantee systems;
- Recommends strengthening the role of local organizations in mentoring rural SMEs and micro-enterprises by improving technical support, information access, and mentoring programs;
- Calls for improved communication to raise awareness of the rural vision among local actors and public authorities, with the EESC continuing its role in promoting and mobilizing around the Rural Pact.
