Why Community-Led Housing?

- Address local need including affordability
- Strengthen community resilience
- Promote sustainable development
- Boost local economy



Types of Community-Led Housing

- Co-housing
 Shared communal spaces
 (kitchens, gardens) with private
 homes; collaborative governance.
- Housing Co-operatives (Co-ops)
 Residents collectively own and manage properties, ensuring affordability through non-profit structure.

- Self-help housing Empty properties are refurbished and brought back, often creating opportunities for training and volunteering.
- **Community Land Trusts (CLTs)** Non-profit organisations hold land in trust, ensuring long-term affordable housing and preventing displacement.
