Rural Pact Conference, Sept. 16-17, 2025

- Took place in Pecq, Belgium
- 250 participants from 27 EU Member States and four non-EU countries, including representatives of EU institutions, public authorities, NGOs, Local Action Groups (LAGs), businesses and researchers
- Focus on advancing the rural vision 2040, contributing to the update of the Rural Action Plan, and shaping the next steps for Rural Pact actions.
- Through interactive sessions, participants reflected on lessons learned from the current Rural Action Plan, co-developed ideas to strengthen its next phase, and explored ways to build capacities for local and national action.
- Interventions from EU institutions and bodies
- At least 11 different EC DGs intervening (more than 25 EC participants)
- More than 65 speakers

Key recommendations for the future

- Create national and regional Rural Pacts that mirror the EU Rural Pact
- Institutionalise multi-level and cross-sector cooperation
- Guarantee long-term, multi-annual, and earmarked support for rural development and LEADER/CLLD, not just within the CAP
- Embed rural proofing systematically at both EU and national levels
- Empower rural communities and youth as co-creators of solutions
- Invest in people and inclusion by expanding rural incubators
